**Course Description:** Create unforgettable learning experiences for students of all ages by immersing them in the joy of handmade books and watercolor that can, together, be used for a variety of purposes – from reflective diaries to science journals to a place to demonstrate understanding of new vocabulary and concepts. Such experiences activate students’ inherent curiosity as well as problem-solving and critical thinking skills.

Educators will learn four different book structures that can capture and support students’ learning in other subjects. The course will also include active demonstration of accessible and grade-adjustable techniques in using watercolor paint and color mixing. The focus will be on basics—from the Elements of Art to simple painting skills—so that all students feel successful and can express themselves in personally satisfying ways.
